The film was also awarded as Select Documentary Film of the Year of 2003 at the South Taiwan Video and Film Festival and won Award for the Best Documentary Film of the Year of 2004 at A Gaze: The Body Documentary Film Festival.

This film is about Professor Mark Thelin, an America Sociologist who came to
